#### Cos'è un barber shop?

Women have been leading the movement for gender equality for decades, and while it is essential that men join the effort, it's necessary to be involved thoughtfully and proactively, in ways that support women's existing efforts and leadership. Following this notion, and building on decades of work for women's rights, the Barbershop concept was developed jointly by the Governments of Iceland and Suriname, as a way to get men involved and committed as partners in promoting gender equality. The first Barbershop Conference, held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York in January 2015, was a great success with over 500 attendees. Around 100 Permanent Representatives took part in the opening luncheon, the first time so many high-level men had come together at the United Nations for the sole purpose of having a candid discussion about gender equality. Building on the success of the Conference, the Government of Iceland has hosted several Barbershop events, including at the NATO Headquarters in Brussels and at the United Nations in Geneva, to put gender equality firmly on the agenda of world leaders.
